**Lord Newton:** Chairman of the Council on Tribunals since 1 October 1999 and a Member of Parliament from 1974-1997. During that period he held many Ministerial offices, including Secretary of State for Social Security (1989-92) and Lord President of the Council and Leader of the House of Commons (1992-1997). Lord Newton was Chairman of the Privy Counsellor Review Committee which reviewed the Anti-Terrorism, Crime and Security Act 2001.

**Francesca Quint:** Barrister practising at 11 Old Square, Lincoln's Inn. Francesca is on the Council of the Statute Law Society and the Committee of the Charity Law Association. She specialises in charity law and has had a close interest in the Charities Bill currently before Parliament. As a legal adviser, Francesca will be well placed to see how the new Charities Act works out in practice.

**Paul Jenkins:** Senior government lawyer, Solicitor to the Department for Work and Pensions and to the Department of Health and Head of Law and Special Policy at the Department for Work and Pensions. Paul was previously Legal Adviser at the Department of National Heritage (subsequently the Department for Culture, Media and Sport) and at the Lord Chancellor's Department (subsequently the Department for Constitutional Affairs). He is a Bencher of Middle Temple.

**Sir Edward Caldwell:** Former First Parliamentary Counsel and now one of the parliamentary counsel at the Law Commission. Edward is also on the Council of the Statute Law Society.

The formal discussion will run from 6 – 7.30 p.m. and will be followed by refreshments.
